

Director's Statement

I made Unibrow for the little girl that used to fake stomach aches so that she wouldn't have to go to school and be ridiculed for looking different. The initial versions of the script reflected my own limited understanding of the nuance and importance of eyebrows in Iranian culture, but in conversations with other Iranian women, I began to understand the importance of eyebrows in Iranian history and culture and felt like a puzzle piece had suddenly fallen into place. As a girl of Iranian descent attending predominantly white schools, it was never lost on me the irony of being made fun of for a culture and identity I never truly belonged in. I realize now that I didn't need to be treated as a "Canadian", I needed someone to be there to help me understand what it meant to be "Irani".



Lina Sennia (Lead: Leyla)

Lina Sennia is an emerging actress best known for captivating audiences with her portrayal of Mina Amani in the popular television series "Ruby and the Well". Her love for body movements got her into contemporary dancing/physical theatre when she was 17 years old. Parastoo had the chance to work with many great directors, dancers, puppeteers and actors both in Iran and Canada in Farsi and English. She has performed at Glendon Theatre, Fringe festival, Cahoot theatre, Pia Bounman school of Ballet and creative movement, Tirgan Festival, Children Peace theatre and Theatre passe Muraille at Rutas festival. Parastoo also acted in 4 short films this year, Khastegari, Unibrow, the decision and locked. She had recently choreographed a short piece of solo contemporary movement under the supervision of Dave Wilson at Pia ballet school. Parastoo would like to make her work available for all people around the world regardless of the language they speak. That is why she likes to tell more stories with her body.





Nedda Sarshar (Director)

Nedda Sarshar is an Iranian-Canadian writer and filmmaker based in the Greater Toronto Area. Her short film idea, Unibrow, was the winner of Reel Asian's So You Think You Can Pitch competition and a recipient of the Canada Arts Council Concept to Realization grant. Her other short Rachel and Raha (a short film about queer women of colour and their immigrant families) is currently in the festival circuit, premiering at the Canadian Film Festival, and winning Best Short Film at the Toronto LGBT Film Festival and Best LGBT Short Film at the Toronto Short Film Festival. She has completed the inaugural BIPOC TV and Film Kids Writing Program, and was a finalist for the IGP*BIPOC TV and Film Accelerator program where she was chosen as one of five (out of 90) applicants to pitch a pilot script to a production company. She is also a prose writer, who has been published in places like Huffington Post Canada and short-listed for contests like the Edna Staebler Personal Essay Contest with the New Quarterly. Her poetry has been selected for the "Best Canadian Poetry 2023". She loves telling stories about diasporas, identity crisis' and star-crossed lovers.





Pirayeh Rastgar (Assistant Director)

Pirayeh Rastgar is an Iranian-Canadian Assistant Director and Filmmaker. From a young age, Pirayeh was fascinated by capturing moments with her camera. She always loved watching movies and was curious about what goes on behind the scenes. When she moved to Canada, she participated in her high school's drama class and had the opportunity to be cast as the lead role in the school's play. This experience ignited even more love and excitement for creating art. However, she initially dismissed these feelings, assuming they were just a hobby that would fade over time. Consequently, she decided to study business at Ryerson University. In her third year of study, she had the opportunity to take a few elective courses related to filmmaking, and all those emotions rushed back to her. After much contemplation, she ultimately decided to give her passion a chance and enrolled in Toronto Film School for film production. Since her graduation, Pirayeh has worked in various roles within the film industry.

During this pandemic, she has gathered 66 countries on 6 continents and made a documentary called Unity showcasing the plight of the human spirit. It was the closing film at Munich Film Festival. Following the release of Unity, Shreya remotely directed a music video called Freedom Dance by Faynyx with got over 1.2 million views on YouTube. Rolling Stone India reported about it. She is an honoree of Forbes 30 Under 30, Top 100 Most Powerful Women of Canada, RBC's Top 25 Canadian Immigrant Awards, and Women's Achiever Award.
