Chelo is a street flower vendor who takes pride in bringing joy to her daily customers through the beautiful flowers she sells. From hand selecting every flower to putting the arrangements together to helping her fellow flower vendors, we follow Chelo throughout her day as she nurtures people with love.

Animation comes to life as she moves through the world around her to showcase the beauty that she sees in the world despite her struggle of being an immigrant in America. When an injustice happens in her day, she allows herself to get emotional but she showcases the strength she embodies by picking up and continuing to fight to provide a life for herself and her family back in Mexico.

A B O U T P E T A L O S

While exploring options of stories to tell for our final AFI project, we immediately thought of our producer, Ahmad's love for flowers. It just so happened that one day, Don & Nicole were driving around the streets of LA and stumbled upon a block with a number of flower vendors. By chance, they pulled over to a particular vendor and started asking questions about her life, her journey to the US, her struggles and how selling flowers is able to sustain her and her family.

This was the story we had been looking for! It was there, we had the inspiration to write a short based on the immigrants who have chosen to dedicate their lives to selling flowers.

We were so impressed by Genoveva, who so willingly let us into her world that we chose to write our story around her. An immigrant woman who came to America in '94, was unable to get a job so she started her flower empire. Genoveva started modestly, buying and selling just a few bouquets a day, but 28 years later has a dedicated garage office where she and her family produce 100's of bouquets a week and have multiple vendors working on her behalf. She is not only providing opportunities for herself and her family but also bringing up the community around her.

With this film, we captured her unique point of view, the hardship and warmth, in both a live-action documentary feel mixed with animation.

This is the first time an AFI student film includes animation! We collaborated with animators, Marc Sanchez from UCLA and Jason Triemer from Kennesaw State University who brought Genoveva's journey to America to life in a magical way.



FILMMAKER'S STATEMENT

Our goal as filmmakers is not only to explore the stories around us, but to use our resources to make a lasting impact and shed light on underrepresented communities. We aim to tell stories that cross borders and bring more diversity to the film industry.

In the same week this film is being delivered, at least 51 migrants have died after being trapped inside a sweltering, abandoned, tractor-trailer truck. The deceased migrants, 39 men and 12 women, most of them citizens of Mexico, were discovered on Monday June 27th, 2022 in an industrial area on the outskirts of San Antonio, Texas.

We dedicate this story to the countless immigrant street vendors who spend their days in the sun working tirelessly to make an honorable living. May they be seen and recognized for the contributions they make to their communities. Perhaps this film will inspire you next time you pass by a flower vendor, to stop, give a kind hello, or support by buying their flowers. We promise, they'll brighten up your day!





GENOVEVA MARTINEZ | CHELO

Maria Genoveva Martinez immigrated to the U.S. from Puebla, Mexico leaving her entire family behind. She crossed the border alone and when she got to the U.S. had nowhere to go or work to provide for her. She started off by buying single flowers at the market and selling 1-2 bouquets at a time in 1994 and slowly grew her business. By selling flowers, she has been able to support her 3 children. She is proud that one of them is in the navy, another an engineer and her daughter is finishing her psychology degree.

Salem Rocabado is a bilingual actor based in Los Angeles. They first made their debut in the original production of Revelation at the 2016 HFF and appears in the Blue Shield of California Do you Hear Me? commercial starring Venus Williams. As a first generation Mexican-American who identifies as queer and non-binary, they believe that diverse representation in media is paramount and is a driven advocate for centering BIPOC and queer voices in media and in their work.

Franceli Chapman-Varela an award winning Afro-Latina(Dominican) Artivist. Franceli performed at Dominican Day parades and festivals and toured with her father teaching the influence of Africa on Latino music and culture. She began her acting career doing off-off broadway at the Castillo Theatre in New York at 17 years old. Franceli has been seen on BET's Original Movie, Open, All American (Netflix), The Real Housewives of Beverly Hills (Bravo) and just won best Actor in a Horror/Scifi film for Cult at the Official Latino Film Festival in November of 2021. She was also a part of the 2021 NHMC (National Hispanic Media Coalition) actor showcase. Her theatre credits include White (CVRep), The House On Mango Street, Blues for Mister Charlie (New Haarlem Arts) and Children of Killers (Katori Hall) to name a few.
