ABOUT JAMARY FILMS

Jamary Films was founded in 2020 to produce the short film Jamary which participated in renowned festivals such as the main competition at the Rio de Janeiro Festival, Cine Eco (Portugal), and Cine Vigo (Spain), winning 8 awards. Jamary Films second production, Tapuia was selected for the Clermont-Ferrand Market 2023, Kinoforum Short Film Festival 2023 and the Philadelphia Latino Film Festival 2023 and will participate in New Filmmakers Los Angeles 2024. Currently, the company is producing the short film Paranóia ou Mistificação, which was selected for the International Documentary Short Film Festival of Kerala (India). Jamary Films is also in the post-production process of its first feature film, Jamary.

ABOUT SYNOPSIS

Bianca, a young Italian-Brazilian woman lives with her family in the countryside of São Paulo; while during her work in the forest, she meets Arú, an enslaved indigenous woman, who is injured after escaping from the farm where was captive; Bianca without thinking about the consequences hides her in her home, which bring conflict and danger to her family's life.
