Melrisa and Saeed create a pod that is mature, intimate, and transient despite being in a world that is becoming more and more isolating dystopian as the days pass. The lockdown and political unrest make her just vulnerable enough to connect with Saeed in a way that opens her up to revitalize her spirit to look for love again no matter what comes her way.

### FILMMAKER'S STATEMENT



As a person othered many times over, I am driven to make and champion layered intersectional stories to show the humanness of those who have been viewed, treated less than human.

Soul Tie was created to showcase Melrisa a single middle age, dark skin, plus size, childfree,

Afro Latina American with an Afro because she needs to be SEEN.

Besides of the representation of Melrisa, I wanted to make a story that reminded society of the Covid lockdown and the racist opportunism of the pandemic. I also wanted to create a non-Hollywood romantic ending. I wanted to show a relationship that isn't often seen but is common. A situationship that is not full of struggle or unrequited love. Humans need affection and love even if temporary. Also, large dark female bodies need to be seen getting adored, so I had to show it.

I relied heavily on the camera lenses, production & costume design, and the original music to create this world. We used Elite Anamorphic Primes and Scheider Cine Xenar glass to give us the scope of 70's movies. The seventies because this a latter GenX story. The design of the set and costumes are their own character reflecting Melrisa's identity as well as the hyperreal world of Shelter in Place Los Angeles. Lastly, the musicality is our heroine's inner soul coming through. Have fun discovering all of the layers in Soul Tie.
