A young Taiwanese American boy falls into an existential crisis when a charismatic Christian pastor comes between him and his overprotective Buddhist mother.

SYNOPSIS

After receiving a dragon jade necklace from his Buddhist mother, young Andy spends the day with a devout Christian family, where he meets a fiery pastor who convinces him that his jade is a devil's totem. Conflicted and terrified, Andy returns home to his wary mother, who goes ballistic upon learning the news, forcing him to navigate the complex terrain of stubborn adults and religious debate to figure out his own truth.





DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

"God & Buddha Are Friends" is a love letter to my mother—the strongest, most fearless, and, let's be honest, most stubborn person I know. As an only child raised by a single mother, our bond is unbreakable, even if her relentless persistence drives me crazy. She never backs down, especially when protecting her family, and I wanted to capture that resilience in this film.

Based on a real event from my childhood, the film follows young Andy, whose Buddhist mother gifts him a jade dragon necklace. After spending time with a devout Christian family, a fiery pastor convinces Andy that his jade is a "devil's totem," leading to an explosive showdown. Through humor and heart, the film explores the tensions of growing up between two cultural and spiritual identities while ultimately showing that we're more alike than we think.

Made on a \$40,000 budget—half crowdfunded—our film was shot over three weekends with a skeleton crew of 25. Post-production was a two-person effort between myself and my filmmaking partner, Ryo Shiina. Our cast features Karin Anna Cheung (Better Luck Tomorrow), Taiwanese icon Janet Hsieh (Fun Taiwan), and Jim Meskimen (How the Grinch Stole Christmas), with breakout performances by Ethan Wang and Emilie Ong.

This film is about more than just religion—it's about how we reconcile love with belief, how we protect those we care about, and how we find common ground even in the most unexpected places.

At its core, it's a film about my mother, but it's also about every parent who fights for their child, every person who has ever questioned their identity, and everyone who has ever found themselves caught between two worlds.

I hope this film sparks conversation, laughter, and maybe even a little self-reflection. Because in the end, no matter what we believe, we all just want to be seen, heard, and loved.

as "Esther"



Anthony Ma

Writer, Director, Producer

Anthony Ma is an award-winning Taiwanese American actor, writer, director, and voiceover artist born & raised in Arcadia, CA. "Chinese Antique" (2009), a short film he wrote and produced, was screened at film festivals nationwide and received audience choice awards at the 168-Hour Film Festival and NFFTY. "Elevator" (2015), a feature he wrote and produced, was filmed in Los Angeles, New York, and Japan, garnering an Honorable Mention for Screenwriting at DisOrient Asian Film Festival. The latest feature he co-wrote, called "Staycation" (2018), premiered at the Los Angeles Film Festival and received the LA Muse Award.

As an actor, he most notably guest starred in "Scandal," "S.W.A.T.," and "This Is Us." The LA Asian Pacific Film Festival awarded him Best New Actor for the rom-com indie feature "Love Arcadia" (2015). He was also a co-host on the HBO Max foodie reality series called "Family Style." An active member of his community, he co-founded and served as the Executive Director of the Taiwanese American Film Festival from 2017-2019.

His work as director of photography and composer for the sci-fi short "Intelligentsia" secured a slot in DUST's tightly curated playlist, a popular YouTube sci-fi cinema channel. His musical work has also included projects overseas for several TV ads and drama series on Fuji Television in Japan.

Currently, Ryo works with Instrument, a creative digital agency, producing content for leading brands and diverse clients such as Din Tai Fung, Huntington Library, Herman Miller, Speedo, Meta, Tillamook, and more.
